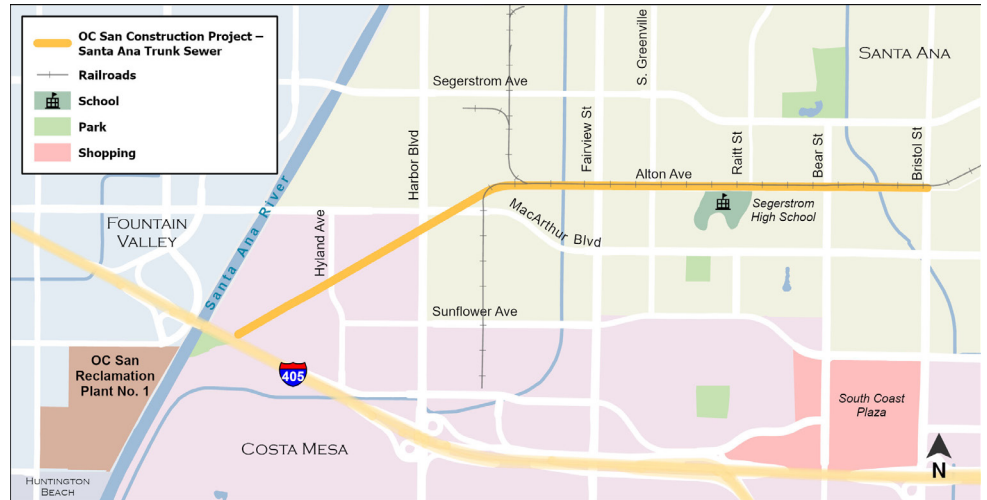


Santa Ana Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation Project

Project Information

The Santa Ana Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation project will rehabilitate a portion of the Santa Ana Trunk sewer in the cities of Santa Ana and Costa Mesa. The project is relining almost 3 miles of existing sewer line to extend its service life. As part of this effort, over a dozen manholes will also be rehabilitated or replaced, and bypass pumps will be needed to reroute sewer flow and maintain service to the community. The work will take place along Alton Avenue starting at Bristol Street and traverse across MacArthur Boulevard, Harbor Boulevard, Scenic Avenue, Hyland Avenue, and Sunflower Avenue as shown in the map.



Project Need

OC San is committed to protecting public health and the environment by proactively replacing and maintaining its infrastructure. The existing sewer line was constructed in the 1950s and 60s and now needs to be rehabilitated to continue providing reliable sewer service.

The Orange County Sanitation District (OC San) is a public agency that provides regional wastewater collection, treatment, and recycling services for approximately 2.6 million people in central and northwest Orange County. OC San operates two facilities, 15 pump stations, almost 400 miles of regional sewer pipes, and treats more than 190 million gallons of wastewater each day.



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
